Welcome/Introductions: Linda Lyons, SILBA SIG President, welcomed all attendees to the

meeting. Linda conveyed to the group that the 2019 Fund year proved to be challenging, however, that her experience with

FutureComp had been very positive.

Approval of Minutes: Referring to the Annual Meeting Minutes from February 18,

2018, Linda asked for a motion.

It was moved by Wayne Moriarty and seconded by Jason Thacker to approve the 2018 Annual minutes as presented in the packet. The motion was approved unanimously by the

membership.

2019 Board of Trustees Referring to the listing of the Trustees and Officers for the 2019

Fund Year, Linda asked for a motion to approve.

It was moved by Deb Torres and seconded by Jay Torrisi to approve the 2019 Board of Trustees as presented in the packet. The motion was approved unanimously by the

membership.

2019 Meeting Schedule

Linda referred to the 2019 meeting schedule in the packet, encouraging Members to be part of the Board of Trustees or the Committees listed. Linda introduced Jennifer Monkiewicz as the FutureComp SILBA Administrator.

Service Team:

Jennifer Monkiewicz introduced all of the FutureComp members of the service team noting claims, loss control, nurse case management and finance.

Membership Listing:

Jennifer noted the listing of Members in the packet, noting that Dartmouth Building Supply was added as a new Member to the SILBA Group as of July 1, 2018.

2018 Claims Overview

Jennifer Monkiewicz presented the claims overview for the 2018 Fund Year noting that the incurred costs for the 2018 Fund Year were much lower than the previous five years of performance. Additionally, that the number of claims that remained open for the Group was decreasing now that many of the older claims had been settled.

2018 Loss Control Overview

Chris Campbell of FutureComp and John Howell, Safety
Committee Chairperson presented the 2018 frequency trends
noting that most of the accidents were due to slips, falls, strikes
from objects and lifting. These areas have proven to be the
most common type and the most costly to the SILBA Group.

Successes were noted: 43 Members had in-person, in-depth visits including comprehensive loss analysis and prevention collaboration. Materials regarding return-to-work were created, safety workshops were held, Saw Stop Program was reintroduced and an in-depth Safety Checklist program was developed to provide SILBA Members with guidance and requirements with the common goal of claims prevention.

2018 Group Performance

Jennifer Monkiewicz presented overall group performance for the 2018 Year. She noted that of the 216 claims received, 154 had been closed; that potential SILBA Members had been identified and are being pursued along with a print marketing plan. Jennifer also noted that there were 25 SILBA Members who had zero lost dollars in 2018.

Speaker Introduction:

Jennifer Introduced Ellen Dorian as the Guest Speaker. She noted that Ellen was a Leadership Strategist and Head Coach with over 20 years of experience in developing successful business and marketing strategies.

Dividends:

Jennifer Monkiewicz announced that the dividends that would be distributed today was \$454,017. She noted that those Members who were unable to attend would be mailed their dividend checks.

Adjournment:

There being no other business, a motion was made by Debra Duff-Torres to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Jason Thacker and the meeting was adjourned at 2:30 pm.


2019 CLAIMS OVERVIEW SUMMARY

SILBA – Claims Overview as of December 31, 2019









A total of 232 claims were reported in 2019, resulting in a total incurred cost of \$1,596,220. Medical only claims reported were up 16% over the total reported in 2018. Lost time claims were down 15% in 2019 compared to 2018.

Total incurred costs were down 8.5% from 2018 as of December 31, 2019. The Group has minimal claims open for the years 1993 to 2012 (8). As of December 31, 2019, 96% of all 2018 claims have been closed.

A total of 2,636 bills were processed in 2019 through our system, resulting in over \$1.3M in savings to the Group. An overall net savings in medical costs of 57%.



SILBA Accident Frequency By Type January 1, 2015 thru December 31, 2019



RE: New Large Loss Investigation Requirements

Dear Self-Insured Lumber Businesses Association Members,

SILBA is always looking for new ways to improve safety and communication with and between Members. Our strength, as a group, has always been the ability to learn from other Members' experiences.

At a recent Claims & Loss Control Committee (CLCC) meeting, the group discussed sharing large, significant, or repeated losses that have occurred during the quarter prior to the CLCC meeting. The Committee, as well as the Trustees, feel that inviting Members with a substantial loss to the CLCC meeting to discuss the claim would be beneficial. Talking points would include reviewing the details of the loss, discussing ways to avoid future similar losses, training and counseling of employees regarding the loss, discussing return to work strategies and light duty opportunities. This new process would be similar to a "Lessons from Losses" or "Best Practices" session and would give others the opportunity to see what the affected Member did to rectify the situation.

Effective January 1, 2020, FutureComp Loss Control will work with the Claims Team and review activity in the prior period. Significant claims will be selected and the impacted Company will be required to participate in the next scheduled CLCC Meeting. Advanced notice will be given to the Members who will be discussed and the Member will supply FutureComp with the name of the company representative who will attend the meeting.

The purpose of implementing this new requirement is not to single out or embarrass a particular Member, but to increase participation in the overall management of the Association and attempt to learn from these events that have the most adverse effect on the Association.

We started this process informally at the August 2019 CLCC meeting and the entire Committee, along with the Board thought it was an extremely valuable process.

Moving forward, Deb Williams, SILBA's dedicated Loss Control Consultant, will make any Members aware of potential incidents to be covered as soon as they are brought to her attention or at the conclusion of each quarter.

We have included the accident investigation form that was developed and adopted by many Members of the Association. It would be helpful for all Members to use this form so that the information will be consistent. We also encourage Members to get Deb Williams involved in either the initial investigation or follow up when there is potential severity involved as she will be able to assist you with the CLCC preparation and actual discussions.

We simply view this as good method to get all Members of the Association involved in the overall performance of SILBA as we all have a collected interest in preventing and managing workplace incidents before and after they occur.

GUEST SPEAKER – SATCH SANDERS

Guest Speaker - Satch Sanders



Tom 'Satch' Sanders had a steady and successful NBA playing career. He was the Green and White's top pick (the 8th pick overall) in the 1960 NBA Draft, from New York University. He played in 916 career games (6th-most in Celtics history) in his 13 seasons - all with the Celtics. (He also served as Head Coach of the team in parts of the 1977-78 and 1978-79 seasons). The Celtics won eight championship titles during his career. He may have averaged only 9.6 points per game for his career, but with a ton of heart, a minimum of fanfare and a maximum of efficiency - Tom 'Satch' Sanders got the job done. His #16 is proudly displayed in the upper right-hand corner of one the Boston Celtics retired number banners, right next to the #1 that is retired for the franchise's original owner Walter Brown. His number retirement ceremony was in January 1973.

A 6-6 center at NYU (where he was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame), 'Satch' lived the NBA life as a forward. He could score and often would be on the receiving end of a fast-break lay-up or crisp pass from Bob Cousy or K.C. Jones that he would put in for an easy two points. But it was on the defensive end where Mr. Sanders made the headlines.

Who you going to call stop Willis Reed, Jerry Lucas, Dave DeBusschere or an Elgin Baylor? It was long before 'ghost busters'. It was 'Satch'.

Quite often 'Satch' was shorter or lighter (he weighed only 210 pounds) than most of the foes he had to deal with night-in and night-out. Did he complain? *Never*. Did he always come through for his team? *Always*. As further evident of the fact that he played in over 450 consecutive games! Durable, smart and the ultimate team player... that was Tom 'Satch' Sanders.

'Satch' has served as the NBA's Vice-President and Director of Player Programs. Based in New York City, his birthplace, 'Satch' designed programs to help both veteran and rookie players take advantage of their unique status as professional athletes and to assist them in coping with the special pressures they face. Player Programs is responsible for facilitating the following: post-career counseling; educational and employment opportunities; the NBA/PA (Players Association) Anti-Drug and Alcohol Programs; advice on dealing with celebrity status and media attention and a nonprofit foundation that benefits former players.
